Impact100 Sonoma Announces 2023 Grants Pool for Valley Nonprofits

**Sets New Funding and Membership Record** 

SONOMA, Calif. — Women's collective giving organization Impact100 Sonoma—one of the

valley's largest funders—will award a record \$337,400 in grants to Sonoma Valley nonprofits in

2023. That amount will raise the group's cumulative grant total since 2010 to \$3,661,900.

For the third year in a row, Impact100 will award multiple Impetus Grants of up to \$25,000 to

selected nonprofits. This strategy of disbursing funds widely, as opposed to offering fewer large

grants, was initiated during the pandemic and is planned to continue long term. Grant recipients

can use the money to sustain their current programs, expand or improve their offerings, or better

fulfill their core mission.

"The wide range of grant applications submitted this year reflects the high level of need in our

valley," said Dana Simpson-Stokes and Kathy Bloch, Grants Oversight Co-Chairs. "We are

more convinced than ever that it is the right decision to spread our funds broadly through the

Impetus Grant program."

Every Impact100 member makes a one-year, fully tax-deductible minimum donation of \$1,000 toward grants. The more members, the more money is available to distribute. "We begin the year with a record-breaking 332 committed member philanthropists," said Membership Co-Chair Sandee Crisp. "This is the power of women giving as one."

On behalf of the Impact100 board of directors, Co-President Claudia Sims said, "We are constantly awed and humbled by the generosity of our members in supporting our nonprofit community and our organization's vision of a just and thriving Sonoma Valley."

The new grants and membership totals were revealed Saturday morning, January 21, at the Sebastiani Theatre during Impact100's Annual Meeting. The event was sponsored by the Sebastiani Theatre. MUFG Union Bank sponsored the education component.

The program included a keynote address by Nancy Dome, Ed.D., Founder and CEO of Epoch Education, a professional development consultancy that helps organizations build trust, inclusiveness, and empathy. Her talk, entitled "Community of Belonging and Compassionate Dialogue," urged members to think beyond dollars donated, to work to resolve the root causes of inequity. She offered tools for addressing difficult topics in ways that help promote understanding among diverse groups, build stronger communities, strengthen organizational effectiveness, and support individual growth and learning.

In February and March, Impact100 member teams will evaluate this year's applications, make site visits, and select finalists for presentation to and voting by the full membership in mid April. The 2023 Impetus Grants will be announced on April 29 at the Annual Awards Celebration, which will take place at Hanna Center and be open to the public.
